Suchomimus was named for its bizarre, narrow, 5-foot-long skull. The skull ends in a cage of long, curved teeth which suggests that, like crocodiles, this dinosaur ate fish. *Suchomimus* had powerful forelimbs and foot-long thumb claws and was the largest and most common predator of its day in Africa. *Suchomimus* belongs to the spinosaur family of dinosaurs. Its closest relative is *Baryonx*, a spinosaur discovered in England.
